## NEVADA DOMESTIC VIOLENCE FACTS

### DOMESTIC VIOLENCE IN NEVADA<sup>1</sup>

- There were 9,022 domestic violence incidents reported in Nevada in 2007.
- Females were reported as the victim in nearly 60% of the domestic violence cases in 2007.
- 8,661 men and 3,023 women were arrested for incidents of domestic violence in Nevada in 2001.
- In 2007, 5,294 children witnessed incidents of domestic violence.
- In 56.7% of domestic violence cases in 2001, no arrest was made because the perpetrator was gone upon arrival of police.

### NEVADA NETWORK AGAINST DOMESTIC VIOLENCE<sup>2</sup>

- The Nevada Network Against Domestic Violence (NNADV) is a statewide organization that helps Nevada's communities respond to the needs of victims of domestic violence.
- NNADV provides advocacy training, technical assistance, and a resource library to Nevada's domestic violence community.

### SEXUAL ASSAULT IN NEVADA

- Nevada is ranked 4th in the nation for sexual assault crimes.<sup>3</sup>
- Nevada has 8,548 registered sex offenders, only 3,750 of which are monitored by Parole and Probation.<sup>4</sup>
- The Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department received 1,514 sexual assault and 1,490 sexual abuse cases in 2003.<sup>5</sup>
- In Nevada, a forcible rape occurs every 8 hours, six minutes.<sup>6</sup>
- Nevada rape rates have increased to a total of 1,094 total reported rapes in 2007.<sup>7</sup>

### CHALLENGES<sup>8</sup>

- Because of the vast topography of Nevada, there are numerous transportation barriers which make access to primary and preventive care services difficult.
- Isolation and desert are disincentives for professionals to establish programs in Nevada's rural areas thus creating a lack of services in these areas.
- In Nevada 29.7% of the population lives at or below the poverty level. The unique domestic and sexual violence needs of this portion of the population should be identified and addressed.
